Admission is \$8.00 per day, or \$5.00 for students and seniors with proper identification. Two day passes \$12.00 general public, \$8.00 for students and seniors. Parking is \$2.00. All profits from this film festival will go to UC Irvine's Model United Nations Club, a non-profit organization.
